The Military-Veterans Pro Bono Committee of the State Bar of Georgia is established to identify the unmet legal needs of Georgia servicemembers and veterans and to meet those needs through coordination of existing resources, through the creation of new resources to train and equip Georgia lawyers, and through outreach to those in need of such legal services.

The first goal is to educate the Committee with regard to the existing military and veteran support infrastructure and to identify the needs that are served by this infrastructure.

The second goal is to identify the needs that are not currently served and construct the methods of meeting those needs.

The primary methods of accomplishing the first and second goals are the questionnaire and making contact with the Judge Advocate facilities at Georgia military bases.

The third goal is to educate and equip the members of the bench and bar of Georgia to meet those needs.

The Committee can set the interim goal that by the time of the mid-year bar meeting, at least one of the more serious legal needs has been identified, resources identified or created, and those resources brought to bear in the State. To accomplish this interim goal, the Committee must recognize that it is not necessary to identify every unmet legal need before a program is designed to address at least one unmet legal need.
