Local Help for People with Medicare

Helping People with Medicare Access Financial Assistance Programs

If you have Medicare, you may qualify for financial assistance programs such as Low Income Subsidy, Medicare Savings Programs and Patient Assistance Programs.

Low Income Subsidy

Anyone who has Medicare can get Medicare Prescription Drug coverage (Part D). Up to \$3,600 each year in extra savings is available for people with limited income and resources. Low Income Subsidy will pay for all or most of the Part D monthly premiums and annual deductibles and lower prescription co-payments.



Medicare Savings Programs

Medicare Savings Programs help people with limited income and resources pay out of pocket Medicare expenses such as: premiums, deductibles and co-payments. The help they get from the Medicare Savings Programs can save them over \$1,100 per year.

Patient Assistance Programs

If you have Medicare and still cannot afford your medicines, you may be able to get help paying for them through patient assistance programs. Assistance is available for name brand and generic medications.
